EXPLAINING THE RISE AND FALL OF ATSIC 1989-2004

Worked as a Research Assistant for Professor Brian Head to examine the events surrounding the establishment and dissolution of Australia's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission considering the recent failure of the Voice to Parliament referendum held in 2023. My research focused on a diverse range of sources such as debates in the federal parliament (Hansard), governmental documents, commentaries and analysis by scholars and practitioners, stakeholder viewpoints, and media releases and commentary.

ARENDT'S TWO TRANSFORMATIONS: A RECONSTRUCTION OF 'NATALITY' FROM 1928 TO 1948

Independent research undertaken for the writing of a Thesis in my Honours year focusing on the development of Hannah Arendt's concept of 'natality' through her early thought. Particular attention was paid to the influence of Martin Heidegger's influence on Arendt, mediated through their shared consideration of the work of Saint Augustine, as well as the impact of Arendt's involvement with Jewish politics and Zionist thought. Examining the latter required a consideration of unpublished materials (letters and lecture notes) in both English and German.
